

## CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

AANP Annual Meeting, June 10-13, 2010

### Abstract submission information

**Abstracts must be received by midnight on February 5, 2010**

We are now soliciting abstract submissions for the 2010 meeting. We are allowing three first author submissions per member. Authors will be sent an email to verify receipt of abstracts. Notification of acceptance and programming decisions regarding the abstracts will also be sent via email.

Abstracts must be submitted online and must include a copyright Release and Disclosure/Conflict of Interest form

Title of Abstract: no longer than 125 characters including punctuation marks (no quotation marks, please), and spaces. Make it simple and factual.

Body of Abstract: You may enter the text directly or create the abstract in Microsoft Word or comparable software, then copy and paste it into the appropriate space. No graphs, figures or pictures are allowed. There is a maximum length of 300 words / 3000 characters. A counter at the bottom of the submission window will let you know the character count as well as the word count.

Topic Category: Choose the single, most appropriate topic category from the drop down list. Program Committee members will be reviewing all abstracts. Where appropriate, abstracts may be shifted to other topic categories for programming the meeting.

Preference for presentation type: Please indicate a preference for oral versus poster presentation. BUT PLEASE NOTE: due to the limited amount of space on the meeting program for oral presentations, most submitted abstracts will be presented as posters. Author preferences will be considered, however, final decisions on the presentation type will be made by Program Committee members following the review of all submitted abstracts.
