

AANP Awards

The American Association of Neuropathologists (AANP) recognizes the importance of certain developments in our field by inviting speakers to present named lectures at the annual meeting, and by presenting awards to work that merits special recognition.

Award recognitions currently presented by the AANP are provided below, with required supporting materials noted. **Interested parties must first submit an abstract and any required materials to be considered for awards.**

Travel Awards *(supporting application materials are required)*

Presenting Authors who are trainees may apply for one of several travel awards to be granted by organizers of the American Association of Neuropathologists. Eligible trainees include individuals who are part of a degree granting program (undergraduate or graduate), postdoctoral fellows, and individuals who are part of a clinical training program including medical students, residents and fellows. Individuals who do not fulfill these criteria need to include a description of their trainee status as part of the required mentor's letter of support. These cases will be assessed on a case-by-case basis to determine whether they should be considered eligible for a Trainee Travel Award.

AANP Travel Awards (any trainee, basic or clinical abstract)

This award is designated for any trainee with the best basic or clinical abstract. The applicant/recipient must be both the Presenter and First Author. Multiple awards are granted. Amount: \$1,000; contingent on recipient registration (in-person or virtual).

- Application Materials Required with Abstract Submission:
 - Upload a letter of support that verifies your training status from a mentor/supervisor (Word or PDF file)

Richard Davis Travel Awards

This award is designated for a trainee with their MD with the best clinically oriented abstract. The applicant/recipient must be both the Presenter and First Author. Multiple awards are granted. Amount: \$500 - \$1,000; contingent on recipient registration (in-person or virtual).

- Application Materials Required with Abstract Submission:
 - Upload a letter of support that verifies your training status from a mentor/supervisor (Word or PDF file)

Medical Student Travel Award

This award is designated for a student enrolled in an accredited medical school with a quality abstract and compelling reason(s) for attending the Annual Meeting in pursuit of their long-term career goals. The applicant/recipient must be both the Presenter and First Author. Amount: up to \$4,000 per awardee; contingent on recipient travel, registration and accommodation expenses.

- Application Materials Required with Abstract Submission:
 - Upload a compelling statement outlining your reasons for attending the AANP meeting and how it aligns with your career goals (PDF file)

AANP Trainee Travel Awards

This award is designated for any trainee with the best basic or clinical abstract. The applicant/recipient must be both the Presenter and First Author. Multiple awards are granted. Amount: \$500.

- Application Materials Required with Abstract Submission:
 - Upload a letter of support that verifies your training status from a mentor/supervisor (Word or PDF file)

ISN Travel Awards

This award is designated for young (<40) neuropathologists/neuroscientists from low-middle income countries submitting a commendable abstract. The applicant/recipient must be both the Presenter and First Author. Multiple awards are granted. Amount: up to \$2,500; contingent on recipient registration (in-person or virtual).

- Application Materials Required with Abstract Submission:
 - Upload a letter of support for receipt of the award (PDF file)
 - Attestation regarding age and location (low-middle income country). *Low-middle income countries are defined by the World Bank [here](#).*

AANP Awards *(no supporting application materials are required)*

Weil Award

This award is designated for the best paper on experimental neuropathology presented at the AANP Annual Meeting.

- Paper Type: Any: Experimental Neuropathology

Moore Award

This award is designated for the best paper on clinico-pathological correlation presented at the AANP Annual Meeting.

- Paper Type: Clinical Neuropathology (Except Neurodegeneration)

Rubinstein Award

This award is designated for the best paper on neuro-oncology presented at the AANP Annual Meeting.

Paper Type: Neuro-Oncology

Hirano Award

This award is designated for the best clinical neuropathology focused paper on neurodegenerative diseases presented at the AANP Annual Meeting.

- Paper Type: Neurodegenerative

Terry Award

This award is designated for the best basic/translational focused paper on neurodegenerative diseases presented at the AANP Annual Meeting.
