## Academic Neuropathologist

The Department of Pathology at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine seeks a full-time faculty member at the rank of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor or Professor. Tenure status will be determined based on qualifications. Service responsibilities include participation in diagnostic neuropathology, which could include surgical, autopsy or neurodegenerative neuropathology, depending on the applicant's career goals. There will be many opportunities for mentoring and teaching medical students, resident and fellows, as well as for service on department, school or university committees. There is also an opportunity to serve as Director of the Neuropathology Fellowship Program. There are currently two neuropathology fellowship positions in the division, a dedicated sign-out room, and a strong and collaborative faculty. Numerous opportunities for investigation are available in collaboration with faculty in the Malnati Brain Tumor Institute and the Mesulam Center for Cognitive Neurology and Alzheimer's Disease, which are both world-class and supported by the NIH.

Qualified candidates will have a MD or MD/PhD degree, AP board certification, NP board certification or eligibility and eligibility for an unrestricted license in the State of Illinois.

The start date is negotiable, and the position will remain open until filled.
