

Children's National Hospital, located in Washington, DC, is searching for a full-time pathologist with board eligibility / certification in anatomic pathology and neuropathology. Children's National Hospital (CNH) is a 313-bed quaternary care academic pediatric hospital located in Washington, DC which also serves the population of surrounding areas. The facilities include a Level I trauma center, the top rate NICU in the nation, a Cardiac and Pediatric Intensive Care Unit. Multiple clinical departments at CNH are ranked in the top 20 by *U.S. News & World Report's* annual rankings, and the hospital is consistently ranked as one of the top 10 overall children's hospitals in the country. CNH has well-known and highly regarded pediatric neuro oncology and neuro oncology research programs as well as neuro developmental and fetal brain research divisions. The Children's Research Institute allows provides for multiple clinical trials as well as faculty participation in translational and basic research opportunities if desired.

The ideal candidate will possess an MD or DO degree (or equivalent) and be board certified or board-eligible in anatomic and neuropathology pathology. Experience and/or board certification in pediatric is also preferred, but not required. The candidate must be capable of obtaining a District of Columbia medical license. The successful applicant will be recommended for appointment as an Assistant, Associate or full Professor at George Washington University School of Medicine and Health Sciences, commensurate with experience and qualifications.

The Division of Pathology & Laboratory Medicine has 17 faculty members including pediatric anatomic pathologists, clinical pathologists covering different disciplines and hematopathologists. The anatomic pathology section receives approximately 8500 cases per year, with approximately 400 bone marrows and 50 autopsies.

Washington, DC and its surrounding areas are extremely active, with easy access to many activities, including sports and recreation. Washington is also centrally located within easy reach of New York City, Philadelphia, Baltimore and other major metropolitan areas.
